A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE MINISTER

A great big Thank You! to all of you who watched and supported our young people in the musical Singin' in the Rain, Jr. this past week, sponsored by Tyro Christian Church Children's Summer Theatre. It was a wonderful experience, both for our young performers, as well as the staff. God was glorified, and many lives were impacted by Jesus by putting on this classic production in a Christian environment.

The redemptive theme of Singin' In The Rain shone through in the script about Kathy (the unknown stage actress) who was asked to overdub the speaking and singing voice of the egocentric Hollywood star, Lina Lamont, in the fictitious musical movie The Dueling Cavalier contained in the musical (much like the play-within-the-play of Shakespeare's Hamlet). The script clarifies that Lina (the antagonist) is everything a spoiled, worldly movie star represents: a selfish, narcissistic, selfabsorbed, vindictive actress who does not win in the end. On the other hand, Kathy represents a virtuous young lady trying to do her best without compromising her values in Tinseltown. She was inventive and encouraging to her fellow artists and helped them save their movie, which threatened a significant loss for the studio. Kathy also agreed to save Lina's career without selfish ambition, even though Lina had been responsible for Kathy being fired from her job--exemplifying what it means to be forgiving and putting others ahead of yourself! * * *

A MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM MINISTER

When you think of the word power, what comes to mind? Many things may come to mind; the power of computers, the power of positive thinking, the power to launch the space shuttle, the horsepower of an automobile, powerboats, powerhouse, power packs, power plants, power play, political power, and the list goes on. We are attracted to power: we want a more powerful computer, more horsepower under our hood, and we want to be around politically powerful people. But is this real power?

Paul says in I Corinthians 1:18, "For the word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." At the cross, we see real power power that was unknown to the world. Before going to the cross, Jesus prayed, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me, nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt." Jesus did not want to go to the cross. He asked God, "If there is any other way by which mankind can be saved - do it however, not my will but your will."

Why was it that Jesus did not want to go to the cross? Was it because of the physical pain associated with the cross? The pain associated with the cross was phenomenal. It was common for the crucified to be whipped, exposing the muscle and the veins in the victim's back. Then the victim had to carry the cross to the crucifixion site. They would nail the victim's hands and feet to the cross there. Within a few hours, the victim would be dead. In all its grim reality, the cross points beyond itself- there is more to the cross than physical suffering. What is it pointing to?

Paul says in 2 Corinthian 5:21, "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf." Jesus, the son of God, the sinless one, when he went to the cross, he became sin "on our behalf." Jesus could not stand the thought of "becoming sin." That is why Jesus did not want to go to the cross. The thought of becoming sin was why Jesus prayed, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me, nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt."

You may be asking, "Where do we see the power?" You see power when Jesus is nailed to the cross, and he could have called twelve legions of angels to his rescue. The nails in Jesus's hands and feet were not keeping Him up on the cross. The Roman soldiers were not keeping Jesus up on the cross. What power was able to keep Jesus on the cross? His love for you and me. Jesus says in John 10:18, "No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have the power to lay it down, and I have the power to take it again". Real power is at the cross. If you want real power in your life, go to the foot of the cross.

GOOD HEALTH GUIDELINES



We want to provide a healthy environment in our Building Block Area, so we are asking you to keep your child at home when any of the following symptoms have occurred within the last 48 hours: Fever / Vomiting,

Discharge in or around the eyes, green or yellow runny nose, excessive coughing, diarrhea, questionable rash. Infectious diseases include mumps, measles, chicken pox, conjunctivitis (pink eye), Strep Throat, Hand, Foot & Mouth, and impetigo. These are to be kept at home until all possibility of contagion is over. You will be notified promptly if your child becomes ill while in the classroom. If your child is being treated with an antibiotic, they should have received treatment for at least 48 hours before coming to class.

PARENTS AND FRIENDS OF TYRO TEENS!

Hello, parents and friends of Tyro Teens! I'm writing this at nearly midnight on Monday, July 17th. I can now say that we can entirely turn the page on the 2022-2023 school year and begin doing full-fledged work on what we will be focusing on in 23-'24.

Before we look ahead, though, I want to take a minute and write about what all transpired in Cleveland, Tennessee, at Christ In Youth's "MOVE" conference. As you may know, this year's theme was "Nevertheless." Taken from Galatians 2:20; "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ lives in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Throughout the week, we explored the topics of:

Jesus is **for** us Jesus is **over** us Jesus is **in** us Jesus is **between** us Jesus **lives through** us

These topics formed one of the most powerful weeks I've witnessed personally among students. Our teens cried. They wrestled with the challenging circumstances in their lives.

They shared their struggles. They dug deep into their Bibles. They stopped. They exhaled. They listened. They asked. And they heard from scripture. They surrendered their chains so they could accept the peace that only Jesus brings.

One of the most encouraging things was seeing our small group leaders interact with the students within their small groups. We are seeing the fruit from consistently being in those small groups. Relationships matter. Our willingness and ability to engage even the most challenging subjects our students deal with comes from a place of trust born from relationships formed over time. All founded on Bible-focused teaching means that we're in an excellent place to partner with you to make disciples!

What can we do to help keep the fires from CIY stoked as we go forward in the year:

Continue praying for the students who went on the Trip. Take a student to lunch and ask them what they experienced and how God is moving in their lives.

Get involved. We have some places in the teen ministry where we could use some help and would love to see if we could use your God-given skills to disciple teenagers!

BUILDING TYRO TEENS: FALL KICKOFF!

Those two images represent much of what we will be doing this fall. The one on the left shows two things: 301 and Ten:10. 301 is going to be what we are going to call our Wednesday nights going forward. There's nothing spiritual about it; 301 is just the address of the Church.

Ten:10 is going to be what we call our Sunday school program. Again, nothing overtly spiritual about it, ten:10 is just the usual time when we get everybody rounded up and headed into class. The image on the left is of a street lit with streetlights. As I was trying to come up with a central image and theme for the teens to focus on this year, this one hit me. Especially as we begin to focus on our role as we live as "aliens and strangers in this world" (1st Peter 2:11), we believers begin to take on the role of streetlights pointing the lost home. This fall, we will be working through the book of 1st Peter.

Parents, you will unpack themes with your students, like being foreigners and strangers because of their faith. Like being a kingdom of priests. Like living a life that points people towards God because of the good choices that flow from it. Our prayer is that this focus will result in the community being transformed. Pray for us.

We kick off on August 23rd at 6:30 PM. Details are to be found on posters and in next month's tidings. It's going to be amazing.
