A MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM MINISTER

We believe strong families are an important part of the church. Nick Stinnett and John DeFrain authored the book "Secrets of Strong Families" They did some research to determine characteristics in strong families - what was it that made for strong families? They concluded from their research that these six characteristics fit nicely into 1 Corinthians.

The six characteristics are:

- 1. Commitment dedicated to promoting each other's welfare and happiness. They value the unity of the family.
- 2. Appreciation of family members frequently and spontaneously show affection for each other.
- 3. Communication spend a lot of time talking with each other.
- 4. Time spend time together not only quality but quantity of time.
- 5. Spiritual Wellness high degree of religious Orientation.
- 6. Coping ability view stress or crises as an opportunity to grow.

Because we believe in strong families, on October 14th and 15th, we will have a Marriage & Family seminar with Karl and Shannon Wendt. They will speak on Saturday evening about marriage and on Sunday morning they will speak about family in both worship services and they will have another presentation during the Sunday School hour.

TRUNK OR TREAT

TRUNK: You may sponsor a trunk for Trunk or Treat. You can supply your own candy or prize (snapon bracelets, pencils, erasers, etc.) We need to have all vehicles in the North Parking Lot between 3:30 PM – 4:00 PM. When handing out candy, please hand out either 1 larger or 2 small pieces of candy. We will have a contest of who has the best-decorated trunk. The top 3 winners will receive a prize.

CANDY: You may bring bags of candy and put them in the tubs located in the Sunday school classrooms or in the tub located in the main foyer. This will be for the trunks that need candy or to supply the trunks that run out of candy. We are expecting anywhere from 450 to 500 children.

Parents, In the Building Block area, we have snacks during each service on Sundays and Wednesday evenings. If you would like to donate items to the Building Block area, here is a list: mini vanilla wafers, mini club crackers, big bag Fruit Loops, goldfish, Debbie Snacks, paper bags, and snack bags. If you have a child that brings an item to church, make sure that the child's name is on the item. This will help the workers in the room to know which item or bag belongs to which child. Please ask the ladies at the check-in desk for help if you need a sticker.

CHECK-IN WORKERS

Check-in workers – you are one of the first to greet our visitors that come. In order to help them get their children to the appropriate place, please be in the check-in area 15 minutes before the start of service. We need to help get the children into the church service area and introduce them to an usher to help them get settled.

GOOD HEALTH GUIDELINES

We want to provide a healthy environment in our Building Block Area, so we are asking you to keep your child at home when any of the following symptoms have occurred within the last 48 hours: Fever / Vomiting, Discharge in or around the eyes, green or yellow runny nose, excessive coughing, diarrhea, questionable rash.

Infectious diseases include mumps, measles, chickenpox, conjunctivitis (pink eye), Strep Throat, Hand, Foot and Mouth, and Impetigo. These are to be kept at home until all possibility of contagion is over. You will be notified promptly if your child becomes ill in the classroom. If your child is being treated with an antibiotic, they should have received treatment for at least 48 hours before coming to class. I appreciate your help in keeping our areas healthy for other children.

MEMORY VERSE

We are learning a memory verse monthly in the Building Block area during the 1st and 2nd services. If your child can say the Verse, they get a piece of candy. The memory verse is "Let us Love one another." 1 John 4:7

FAMILY SUNDAY

Sunday, October 29th, is the 5th Sunday, a Family Sunday. If your child is four and older, they will go into the auditorium with you. We've had kick-off, we've had a movie afternoon, and we've had a great first month! Let's talk about all of that as well as look ahead to next month!

STREETLIGHTS INTO MASKS

So we're calling for a pause for streetlights until January. We've had a lot of good things come from this part of looking at 1st Peter, but we're going to take a break so we can focus on some other things that are really pertinent to where we're at. I'm a big fan of following the natural rhythms of the calendar, and with the calendar soon flipping over to October, we have one of those natural rhythms where it's really easy to talk to the kids about masks. So we're going to talk with the students about their identity and about the different masks that they use to hide some of the pains that they've experienced and how they can find freedom from all of it in Christ. Pray for these students and us adults as well as we do our best to point these kids towards Jesus and towards the full life that He alone offers us.

FALL. COOKOUT. WORSHIP. AWESOMENESS

On October 25th, we're going to be having a cookout at the Jabben's! We'll be meeting still at 6:30, but we're going to have a fun night with some games, some food and some music! It'll be a great time where the kids can join together in some fellowship and fun. We'll send home more details as we get closer!

THE "EVENT"

The "Event" is going to be quite the event.... This year, OCC is using the theme of "To be continued" and we'll be talking about how different life looks like for us post Acts 28. I'll be able to tell you more about what that'll look like when October comes after we've been to "Getaway". The deadline for registering for this will be October 18th. ONE LAST BIG THING

Parents, this last month we had a parent's meeting, and if you weren't able to make it, let me take some time and try and catch you up.

At that meeting, we were able to chat about the roles that each of us holds, and how we're going to live those roles out with each other. Your role as the parent is that of the primary disciple-maker for your student. That's Deuteronomy 6, that's Ephesians 6, that's the whole book of Proverbs! Your job is to help the faith grow in your students. Christian Smith says that, based on his research, informal conversation between parent and teenager is the primary way the faith is transmitted. To which, Richard Ross asks, what if we created times and places for that to happen? You might ask, "If that's my role as a parent, what role does that make for you? I mean, why exactly are you getting paid?" Here's what my role is: You, as the parent, are the primary disciple-maker in your home, but that doesn't mean that you are alone. My job is to try and put people in place to partner with you in making your students into disciples. My job is to try and create places and time and content to help you with those conversations and to give additional voices that are saying the same things you're saying so that we can see these kids become the next wave of preachers and elders and church leaders! I have the best job in the world, and I am so thankful to be able to come alongside you all and try and help you as we point these students towards the Lord. I want you to know that we are praying for you and that we eagerly desire to partner with you and see you succeed in your homes because what happens at home is more important than what happens at church. One tool that I want to equip you with is the Band app. This is an app that will help you keep up to date with info exclusively for parents. Our hope is that this will be the spot that will keep those conversations going with questions that you can nonchalantly ask your students about the things that we've been talking about here on Sundays and Wednesdays. Be sure to download it!
