

A MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM MINISTER

New Years is a time people make resolutions. Here are some unusual resolutions people have shared on Twitter. Stop kids from eating dirt. Stop procrastinating, but not today. Use my gym membership more often. Don't make any New Years' resolutions. Always leave one potato chip. Get lost without any help from Siri. People make more common resolutions: exercise more; lose weight; get organized; learn a new skill or hobby, and quit smoking. Most people have good intentions regarding their resolutions. As time wears on, so does the resolve to keep the resolution.

A man in scripture makes a resolution that he keeps. It is a resolution all of us would be well advised to make. He was a victorious military leader. He was a member of a select group of men entrusted with making a report on some land. He stood opposed to the report of the majority. He became the leader of a nation and led the conquest of the Promised Land. Joshua was a man of great strength, courage, and valor.

When God entrusted the nation of Israel to Joshua's leadership, God told Joshua three times to "Be strong and of good courage." Here is a man who had already displayed great strength and courage when he defeated the Amalekites. Again, he displayed his strength and courage when he said they could take the Promised Land. Why did God tell Joshua three times, "Be strong and of good courage"? He needed encouragement, which is precisely what God was doing: encouraging Joshua.

After God tells Joshua to "be strong and very courageous," He immediately tells him to be "careful to do according to all the law which Moses my servant commanded you; turn not from it to the right hand or the left, that you may have success wherever you go" (Joshua 1:7). Notice, God does not tell Joshua to believe the Law. Still, He tells him, "To do according to all the law."

It is one thing to say I believe in God and His Word, and it is another thing to live according to His Word. When you choose to be a Christian, you have chosen to live according to God's Word. In essence, you have chosen "The Road Less Traveled." Jesus says of the Christian life, "For the gate is narrow, and the way is hard, that leads to life, and those who find it are few" (Matthew 7:14). It takes strength and courage to live according to God's Word.

Does Joshua heed God's Word? Is he "strong and of good courage"? Is he "careful to do according to all the law" and "turn not from it to the right hand or the left"? The answer is found in the 24th chapter of Joshua. Joshua recounts how God dealt with Israel

as a nation in that chapter. Joshua then challenges the people to "fear the Lord, and serve Him in sincerity...choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the land beyond the River, the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell".

It took strength and courage for Joshua to take that challenge. Joshua again demonstrates his strength and courage by not turning to the right or the left. Joshua resolves, "but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." Demonstrate your strength and courage by deciding to "serve the Lord." "Be strong and of good courage; be not frightened, neither be dismayed; for the Lord, your God, is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

In 2023, make Joshua's resolution your resolution, "but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE MINISTER

With the New Year comes a sense of new beginnings—a fresh start to another orbit around the sun, filled with possibilities. The Lord told the prophet Isaiah concerning His people's past and future:

"But forget all that--it is nothing compared to what I am going to do, for I am about to do something new. See, I have already begun! Do you not see it? I will make a pathway through the wilderness. I will create rivers in the dry wasteland" (*New Living Translation* Isa 43:18-19).

And the Apostle Paul tells us in a letter addressed to the Church at Philippi:

"No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us" (*New Living Translation* Phl 3:13-14).

As we reflect on this past year, let us think about how the Lord has moved in our lives and give Him thanks. And then, let us rejoice in the knowledge that He is not finished with us yet, but wants to do a new thing in us as we strive and press on in our walk with Him! Onward to 2023!

CHECK-IN WORKERS

Check-in workers – you are one of the first to greet our visitors that come. In order to help them get their children to the appropriate place, please be in the check-in area 15 minutes before the start of service. We need to help get the children into the church service area and introduce them to an usher to help them get settled.

BABY DEDICATIONS

Are you planning to dedicate your new arrival? We have a blessing for you. Our Blanket Blessing team would like to bless your latest arrival with a handmade quilt. *If you know when you would like to dedicate your child, please contact Stephanie Owen in our church office so that we can arrange for your quilt to be available for your dedication.*

WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

We will start on January 4th! We will begin learning the 10 Commandments. This will be a fun, exciting time. If you are not connected to a Bible Study on Wednesday evenings, there are several, and this is also an excellent time for your children to be in God's word (Building Block 2's – K's or Faith Factory 1st – 6th grade). BUILDING BLOCK AREA SECURITY

Parents, when you come to pick your child up from the Building Block area, please have your number sticker visible, so the worker can see it when you pick your child up from the Building Block area. We also ask that **only one** family member (**14 years of age or older**) pick up the children. This is a safety measure and will help our security personnel to keep our Building Block area secure. If several adults with older children go in to pick up one or two children, our secure area is no longer secure. Thank you for being so helpful in this matter.

NEW YEARS

Everyone has plans for a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. We are ready to start a new year serving the Lord. "O God, you have taught me from my earliest childhood, and I have constantly told others about the wonderful things you do." Psalm 71:17. Who have you told about the beautiful things God has done for you this past year? Children have no problem sharing what they have learned!

GOOD HEALTH GUIDELINES

We want to provide a healthy environment in our Building Block Area, so we are asking you to keep your child at home when any of the following symptoms have occurred within the last 48 hours: Fever / Vomiting, Discharge in or around the eyes, green or yellow runny nose, excessive coughing, diarrhea, questionable rash.

Infectious diseases include mumps, measles, chicken pox, conjunctivitis (pink eye), Strep Throat, Hand, Foot & Mouth, and impetigo. These are to be kept at home until all possibility of contagion is over. You will be notified promptly if your child becomes ill while in the classroom. If your child is being treated with an antibiotic, they should have received treatment for at least 48 hours before coming to class.

I appreciate your help in keeping our areas healthy for other children.

You might also want to talk to your broker concerning the giving of stocks. You would get a better value for your stocks by giving them to the Church.
