A MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM MINISTER

Very often, we Americans forget our relatively recent ancestry and take our lives on this continent for granted. It is rare to find someone now who can grasp the true meaning of "having it rough" and the harsh realities of actual survival. America's history, in comparison to other nations, is very short, indeed.

The pilgrims sailing across the Atlantic Ocean on the Mayflower landed at Plymouth Rock in December 1620. The pilgrims lived off of their provisions through the brutal New England winter.

They planted a communal garden in the summer, but the settlers did not know how to plant Indian corn, and the crop was small. In November 1621, more pilgrims arrived without adequate provisions.

Governor William Bradford was worried when he calculated that the food would only last six months at half ration per person.

After the second hard winter, another ship arrived in May 1622 with seven more pilgrims and some letters but no food. The food supply was almost gone, and these early settlers were starving.

In the summer of 1622, another ship brought some food. The ration was now a quarter of a pound of bread each day. Because of their hunger, settlers went to their community garden and stole food.

The thieves were whipped when caught. The communal garden idea was not working, so in early 1623 the settlers decided to parcel out the land to individual families and let all families tend their crops.

After planting their seeds in the spring of 1623, the settlers were deeply concerned about whether the crops would grow.

Governor Bradford noted that all the families meant it when they prayed, “Lord, give us this day our daily bread.” When the next ship arrived in the summer of 1623, the passengers were shocked and frightened by the look of the starving pilgrims.

In autumn 1623, the harvest of the pilgrim’s private gardens was now a great success. In this spirit of deep gratitude to God, Governor Bradford declared a day of Thanksgiving.

Harvests were plentiful in the years to come, but the pilgrims put five kernels of corn by their dinner plates on Thanksgiving to remind them of the great suffering endured by the first settlers.

This Thanksgiving, let’s be like the pilgrims, be mindful of the sacrifices others have made on our behalf, and reflect on the many blessings God has given us.

GOOD HEALTH GUIDELINES

We want to provide a healthy environment in our Building Block Area, so we are asking you to keep your child at home when any of the following symptoms have occurred within the last 48 hours: Fever / Vomiting, Discharge in or around the eyes, green or yellow runny nose, excessive coughing, diarrhea, questionable rash.

Infectious diseases include mumps, measles, chickenpox, conjunctivitis (pink eye), Strep Throat, Hand, Foot & Mouth, and Impetigo. These are to be kept at home until all possibility of contagion is over. You will be notified promptly if your child becomes ill in the classroom. If your child is being treated with an antibiotic, they should have received treatment for at least 48 hours before coming to class. I appreciate your help in keeping our areas healthy for other children.

FAMILY SUNDAY

Sunday, October 30th, is the 5th Sunday, a Family Sunday. If your child is four and older, they will go into the auditorium with you. Also, if your child dresses up as their favorite Biblical Character this Sunday, they will receive a prize that morning. This will happen during 1st and 2nd services. **From 4:30 PM to 6:00 PM, we will have our Trunk or Treat in the North parking lot on Sunday evening.** We will have a signup sheet for you to signup for bags of candy, food, sponsor a trunk, help serve, help set up/clean up. This will be a great time of fellowship and serving God.

On Wednesday nights, we've been able to explore the beatitudes. We'll be finishing those up in October and moving into a series about community in November.

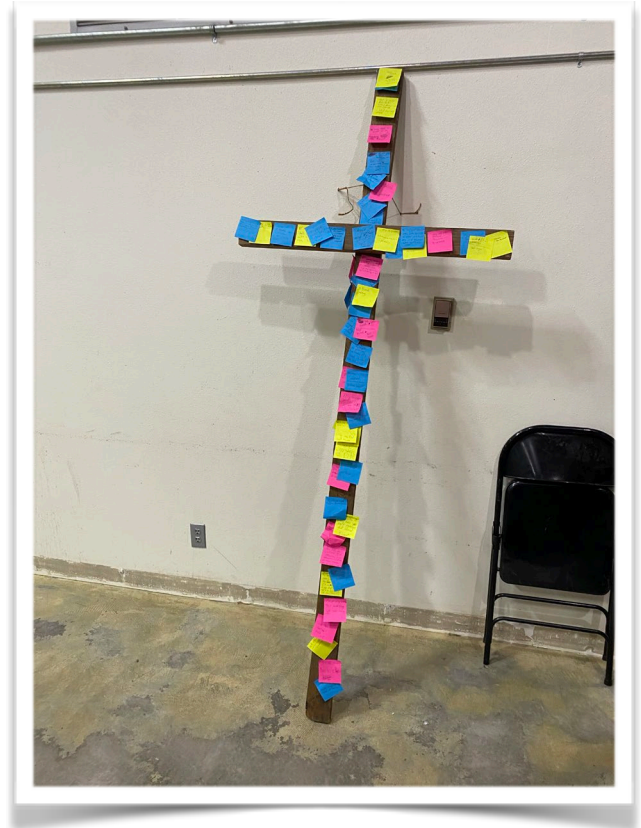
WHAT'S GOING ON IN NOVEMBER
